Catalog description: This course provides training and learning experiences in machining operations at an intermediate level. Students will be using the lathe, milling machine and other machine tools to complete projects. The finished projects will be inspected graded and returned to the student.

Course learning outcomes: Students successfully completing this course will be able to:

- Set-up and operate the vertical milling machine and the engine lathe.
- Apply safe shop practices.
- Understand the relationship between cutting speed, feed rate and depth of cut.
- Understand tool geometry and use a bench grinder to sharpen a drill and a tool bit.
- Make accurate measurements with a ruler, micrometer and caliper.
- Understand tolerances and clearances as they relate to an assembly.
- Demonstrate precision lay-out skills.

Learning activities: This course will include lectures, quizzes, tests, demonstrations and machine shop projects.

Assessment tasks: A student's progress will be evaluated as follows:

- Attendance, participation and quizzes 100%
