• What is an LBCC scholarship or grant?

It is financial assistance given to a student to help cover the cost of education.

• Do I have to repay an LBCC scholarship or grant?

No. It does not have to be repaid. It is not a loan.

• How do I know if I am eligible for an LBCC scholarship or grant?

Eligibility requirements vary. For more information, read this brochure, ask your instructors and check with your major department.

SCHOLARSHIP AND GRANT DESCRIPTIONS

Cascade Corporation

In recognition of the outstanding students that have been trained at LBCC, Cascade Corporation has established a scholarship for students in Welding or Manufacturing Technology. This scholarship is to help a second-year student remain in the program. To apply, complete an application and any supporting documents, available in the spring from the Division of Science and Industry, and return to the same office by the date indicated on application. The student must have a 3.0 GPA in their first year of study. **Award amount is for full-time tuition for three (3) terms. Catherine Evanson Memorial

This award was established by members of Catherine Evanson's family after her death in 1984. Catherine began her 50-year nursing career in her native Scotland and also served in Africa, Egypt, India, Canada, and in the local Corvallis area. This award is made available to second-year students on the basis of academic ability, financial need, and potential for success in the nursing profession. Farrier School Scholarship

Originally this fund was used to construct a building for the Farrier School. Currently the fund provides assistance to students who enter the farrier trade or students who are increasing their skill levels. Priority may be given to first-year students. Awards will be made primarily on the student's potential to benefit from the training and secondarily on financial need. **Award amount \$50 - \$100. David Jordan Memorial Scholarship

David Jordan, the son of James and Carol Jordan, was killed in a car accident while serving in the U.S. Army in West Germany. This memorial scholarship fund is to assist students in mechanical, metals, agricultural, or related fields of study. Preference will be given to graduates of West Albany and South Albany high schools. All scholarship applications will be evaluated on financial need and the prospect of successful completion of a course of study. **Award amount varies. Kathy Kemp Memorial Scholarship

Kathy Kemp, a dental assistant student, was killed in an automobile accident on June 19, 1983. In August of 1983, a memorial fund was created to provide a scholarship for a student in the Dental Assistant Program. This scholarship is awarded to students in their third or fourth term of study. Application information is announced in class winter term. The funds are awarded for spring term. All scholarship applications will be evaluated on financial need, satisfactory academic standing, and demonstration of interests and personal qualities which exemplify high standards of dental care. **Award amount is \$100. Fritz Kleinschmidt Memorial Scholarship

Fritz S. Kleinschmidt was a remarkable man who immigrated to the United States after World War II and eventually settled in Corvallis. A leading member of the LBCC Drafting/Engineering Advisory Committee and a leader in his field, this scholarship in his memory honors his dedication and devotion to his profession. Each year one scholarship is awarded to a second-year student currently enrolled in the Associate Degree Civil Engineering Technology program. Availability of applications is announced during spring term. All scholarship applications will be evaluated on financial need, grades, attendance, and motivation. **Award amount varies based on availability of funds. Michael F. Klopping Memorial Scholarship

Mike Klopping, an EMT student, died suddenly of a heart attack while running. He was a physically active young man who held a deep concern about the health and wellness of his fellow human beings. Each year, in his memory, three scholarships are awarded to second-year students in the EMT Program. To apply, complete an application and any supporting documents, available from the Health Occupations main office during winter term. All scholarship applications will be evaluated on financial need and academic achievement. **Amount awarded is three scholarships of \$333 each. LBCC Scholars Award

This scholarship was created by the LBCC Board of Education to recognize outstanding high school seniors in Linn and Benton counties. To qualify, a student must currently be enrolled in one of the 11 high schools in the LBCC district and be a senior. To apply, complete an application and any supporting documents, which are available from the local high school counselors during winter term. Return the application to high school counselors by the due date on the application. All scholarship applicants must have an overall GPA of 3.00. Special consideration will be given to individuals who have shown outstanding ability in the subject area that will be pursued in college. **A minimum of 27 full-year, full-tuition scholarships will be awarded. Libby Vocational Scholarship

The Libby Vocational Scholarship was created to encourage and assist Willamette Valley students in pursuing an education in a vocational field. To be eligible, an applicant must have resided in the Willamette Valley (Benton, Lane, Linn, Marion, Polk or Yamhill counties) and be enrolled for at least half time (6 credit hours) in one of LBCC's vocational programs. In addition, the student must demonstrate financial need. To apply, complete an application and any supporting documents, available from the LBCC Financial Aid Office. All scholarship applications will be evaluated on GPA, satisfactory progress, and financial need. **Award amount for full-time recipients may be up to \$200 per term and for half-time recipients may be up to \$100 per term for up to six terms each. Marilyn Lieberman Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship was created in the memory of Marilyn Lieberman, a former instructor in the LBCC Business Division, and is available to students in Computer Programming, Data Processing, and Mathematics. All scholarship applications will be evaluated on academic performance, financial need, and professional promise. **Award amount varies depending upon the availability of funds. Susan K. Liljeberg Memorial Scholarship

Susan K. "Lilj". Liljeberg, was a 1975 graduate of the LBCC Associate Degree Nursing program, who was beginning a promising professional career when she was killed in an automobile accident. The Susan K. Liljeberg Nursing Scholarship was established as a memorial to her enthusiasm, vitality, and the concept of the "total nurse." One scholarship per year is awarded to a second-year nursing student. To apply, complete an application and any supporting documents, available from the Health Occupations office in January. All scholarship applications will be evaluated on the basis of grades, attendance, motivation, nursing ideals, and financial need. **Award amount is \$350. Lois Marchbanks Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship fund was established in December 1987 in memory of Lois Marchbanks, to assist a second-year student in nursing. To apply, complete an application and any supporting documents, available from the Health Occupations Office in January. All scholarship applications will be evaluated on financial need, and good academic credentials. **Award amount is \$175. Virginia Moffit Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship was established in memory of Virginia Moffit by Dr. Richard Moffit to assist a second-year nursing student. To apply, complete an application and any supporting documents, available from the Health Occupations Office in January. All scholarship applications will be evaluated primarily on financial need and secondarily on scholastic achievement. **Award amount is \$750. Oregon State Sheriffs' Association Scholarship

This scholarship was created by the Oregon State Sheriffs' Association to assist second-year students in Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice programs who are attending LBCC full time. Applications are distributed during fall term after the funds have been authorized by the Sheriffs' Association. The exact date varies. Applications are available from Jerry Phillips or the Financial Aid Office and must be returned to the Financial Aid Office by the due date listed in the application. All scholarship applications will be evaluated on academic performance, financial need, and professional promise. **Award amount is \$500. Gordon D. Otta Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship fund is awarded to a Lebanon High School student who plans to enroll in the Auto Technology, Auto Body, or Heavy Equipment/Diesel programs. To apply, complete an application and any supporting documents, available from the Division of Science and Industry, IA 141, and return to the same office. All scholarship applications will be evaluated on the greatest potential to achieve excellence in the technology the student has selected to study. **Award amount varies. Program Grant

This award is available to new students in any major who enroll full time at LBCC. To qualify, a student must enroll full time, declare a specific major (undeclared majors and Associate of General Studies candidates will not be considered) and be a new student at LBCC. Any student who has attended LBCC full time during the previous three years will not be considered. To apply, complete an application and any supporting documents available from the LBCC Financial Aid Office. Return the application according to directions. All scholarship applications will be evaluated on the potential for career success and academic standing. All applicants must have a minimum 2.00 GPA from the last school attended. **Award amount is equal to one term of half- or full-time resident tuition. Ed Stewart Memorial Scholarship

In 1975, a welding scholarship fund was established to assist financially needy students who had a desire to pursue an education in the field of welding. In 1985, this fund was renamed in the memory of Ed Stewart, a former LBCC welding instructor who died January 7, 1985. **Award amount varies. Talent Grants

This award is made available to high school seniors and currently enrolled LBCC students who have demonstrated outstanding ability in a given area. Students who participate in music, journalism, athletics, drama, agriculture, business, livestock judging, performing arts, women's center and student government may be eligible. To apply, contact the appropriate LBCC division director to obtain information and an application. **Award amount is equal to full or partial tuition per term. Contact the appropriate LBCC division director for more information.**

Barbara Jean Wright Memorial Scholarship

Barbara Jean Wright died in 1972 at the age of 25 from Systemic Lupus Erythematosus. In her memory, the Barbara Jean Wright Memorial Scholarship was established to assist a freshman (first-year) student in nursing during their second and third terms of study. To apply, complete an application and any supporting documents available from the Health Occupations Office in January. All scholarship applications will be evaluated on financial need and satisfactory academic standing. The recipient of this scholarship should also display the interests and personal qualities which exemplify high standards of nursing care. **Award amount is \$300.
