Course Description:

The Healthcare Provider course is designed to teach the skills of CPR for victims of all ages (including ventilation with a barrier device, a bag-mask device), use of an automated external defibrillator (AED) and relief of foreign-body airway obstruction (FBAO). It is intended for participants who provide healthcare to patients in a wide variety of settings.

Student Learning Outcomes:

Upon successful completion of the course with a "C" or better, students will meet the following measurable learning outcomes:

- 1. Define basic terminology.
- 2. Identify an individual who is in need of immediate care.
- 3. Demonstrate the proper techniques involved in administering aid in a variety of emergency situations.

Additional Course Objectives:

As a result of this course, students will also be introduced to the following:

- 1. The pathophysiology, recognition and treatment of heart disease and stroke and the concept of prudent Heart living.
- 2. The information and techniques needed for adult and pediatric CPR and special rescue situations.
- 3. The information needed to treat VF with an AED.
- 4. The pathophysiology, recognition, treatment and prevention of foreign body airway obstructions.
- 5. Injury prevention in the pediatric age group.
- 6. Safety factors in training and actual rescue.
- 7. Understanding the human dimension of CPR, including the psychology of resuscitations and stress management through critical incident stress debriefing.
- 8. Ethical and legal considerations in CPR.

Skill objectives: Demonstrate for Adult-Child-and Infant

- 1. How to size up the scene
- 2. How to perform a Primary Assessment
- 3. Usage of pocket mask
- 4. Face up and recovery positions
- 5. Care for breathing emergencies
- 6. Usage of bag-valve mask resuscitator with two rescuers
- 7. How to care for obstructive airway for conscious and unconscious situations
- 8. How to perform single rescuer CPR
- 9. How to perform two rescuer CPR
- 10. How to perform usage of the AED alone and with CPR in progress

Criteria for course completion and certifications:

- 1. Students must attend all class sections
- 2. Demonstrate:
 - a. Correct decision-making,
 - b. Sequence care steps properly
 - c. Complete ALL required skills without coaching or assistance
- 3. Written examination with a score of 80% or better
- 4. Receive said card thru Linn Benton Community email account from Red Cross and print off their own card
- 5. CPR card is valid from 2 years from date on card
