Course Description

Focuses on the foundational skills and concepts needed to be persistent and successful in MTH 105 Math in Society. Provides students with appropriate support as needed in arithmetic, algebra, problem solving, technology, and study skills in an interactive setting. **Grading: P/NP (1 credit)**

MTH 199 Course Outcomes

- 1. Solve application problems, communicate, and interpret the results in context.
- 2. Demonstrate relevant skills to effectively engage with the concepts and skills needed in MTH 105.
- 3. Utilize study habits and learning strategies that promote success in MTH 105.

Required materials

- Reliable internet access
- Laptops or tablets needed during class
- Binder and all materials for MTH 105 Class

Attendance

You will meet weekly with your instructor during both of the scheduled class times with an additional 1 hour working in the Math Cafe, (WH-227) with a tutor, or attending Academic Coaching sessions. (WH-226)

Class Work

In class, you will work on activities to review and learn math skills relevant to success in Math 105. You will also meet with the instructor to review your progress, questions and study goals. Small group work and test review sessions will also occur during some classes.

Grading Items (further explanation below)

25%...Weekly Attendance and participation in **BOTH** MTH 199 and MTH 105

25%...Before Class work and Reflection Forum Posts on My Open Math

25%...Weekly In-Class Activities turned in on My Open Math or in person

25%...Weekly Lab Hour using the Math Cafe/Learning Center Resources (sign in and out of TutorTrac)

Students will need to achieve an overall 80% average in the course in order to receive a "Pass" grade and earn credit.

Weekly Attendance and participation in BOTH MTH 199 and MTH 105

Students will earn points weekly by attending each MTH 105 class (4), attending each MTH 199 class (2), and logging an additional 1 hour in TutorTrac while utilizing Learning Center Services.

"Before Class Work" and "Reflection Forum Posts" on My Open Math

Students will have brief, weekly assignments to complete <u>before the first class or after the last class of each</u> <u>week</u>. These will be listed on My Open Math. For reflections, students will submit a forum post at the end of the week of class. There will be a topic or question(s) for them to address in their post on My Open Math.

Weekly In-Class Activities turned in on My Open Math or in person

Students will work on skill-building activities during class time. These are designed to give students more practice with skills and concepts for MTH 105.

Time using the Math Cafe/Learning Center Resources

The third hour of class will be spent utilizing support resources. This may include working on MTH 105 homework while in the Math Cafe or Learning Center, working on MTH 105 with a <u>tutor</u>, or seeking out any type of Academic Coaching provided by LBCC. This time will be logged into TutorTrac or Aviso when the student signs in and out of the computers in the Math Cafe', <u>Learning Center</u>, <u>Academic Coaching</u> workshop, or tutoring sessions. **Students will submit a weekly report of their time using these resources.**

- 1. Go to www.myopenmath.com
- 2. Click on "Register as a New Student" or "Enroll in a New Class"
- 3. Enter a user name, I recommend using your student ID number
- 4. Choose and confirm a password, one you will not forget
- 5. Enter your first and last names, and your e-mail address
- 6. Enter the Course ID: 142030
- 7. Enter the Enrollment Key: MTH199 SP22
