LBCC is committed to helping our students succeed. Graduation is a big part of that success. Achieving the Dream is a tool the college is using to help identify our strengths and improve on our shortfalls.

LBCC is in the second year of its Achieving the Dream experience. We have implemented and are measuring efforts designed to help more students succeed than ever before.

The college is focusing efforts on the first-year experience to equip students with the knowledge and connections that help them flourish and reach their goals. LBCC Institutional Research built an Initiative Command Center (no longer active) as a part of our process.

Using data to make informed decisions, the college has implemented several initiatives around student success, including Destination Graduation class, assigning advisors, and offering accelerated writing and math programs.

Data will help us determine if these initiatives are helping our students, and in what way. With ATD, we are actually tracking our students, rather than faculty, classes or budgets. Tracking our students will help us determine the correct course of action to help them succeed and complete their goals.
