Course Description:

PSY 201 General Psychology is an introduction to several of the different subfields and methods of study in psychology. Students should leave this course with an understanding of the biological and cognitive aspects of psychology, including history, methodology, biological foundations of behavior, human development, sensation, perception, learning, memory, language and problem solving. There are no prerequisites for this class, however, it is recommended that you place at or above the ALS 115 Advanced College Reading and Learning Strategies and WR 115 Introduction to College Writing levels are recommended for success in this course.

Course Objectives/Learning Outcomes:

As a result of successfully completing this course, you should be able to:

- Describe major facts and theories from the domain of psychology.
- Recognize and articulate the interplay between social, psychological and biological forces.
- Apply relevant psychological phenomena to everyday relationships and situations.
- Combine and synthesize psychological concepts and theories to draw reasonable conclusions, develop intelligent skepticism, and critically analyze information

Grades:

Your final grade will be assigned based on the total number of points earned during the course and the weight of each of the assignments. You will be assigned to the letter grade corresponding to your % of total points according to the table below:
