Course Description

A required course for 1st Year Welding & Fabrication Technology majors designed to introduce basic principles and procedures of pipe welding and providing limited experience with SMAW, TIG, and other welding processes on steel pipe. Students will layout, cut, fit and weld various pipe joint configurations as part of the curriculum.

Upon successful completion of this course, students will be able to:
Use welding equipment, cutting equipment, and shop equipment safely. Perform welds on steel pipe with SMAW, TIG, and other welding processes. Use pipe templates for increased accuracy. Employ industry-standard pipe welding methods and techniques. Utilize flame-cutting and plasma arc cutting equipment. Layout, cut, and fit pipe joint configurations.
