Offers credit for music rehearsal directly related to Performing Arts Department performance. Course may involve musical performance in musical theater, workshop course specially designed, or combination courses as outlined by the department. Note: May be repeated three times for credit.

- 2. Explain and support interpretations of the expressive intent and meaning of musical works, citing as evidence the treatment of the elements of music, contexts, (when appropriate) the setting of the text, and personal research.
- 3. Demonstrate how interests, knowledge, and skills relate to personal choices and intent when creating, performing, and responding to music
