## \*Chapter reading assignments:

- 1. Read chapter(s) before class.
- 2. Come to class with answers to the five multi-choice questions found at the end of each chapter.

### Exams:

Exams questions are multiple choice, true/false and short answer essay. If you cannot take an exam on the scheduled date you must notify me in advance so alternate arrangements can be made. You must have <u>compelling and documented circumstances</u>, in order to be eligible, at my discretion, to make-up a missed exam.

# Writing assignments:

Students write two short essays (one to two pages) during the term. These essays give you the chance to both apply points of law and to explore your ethical viewpoint on current issues. As in any business document, proper spelling, grammar, and punctuation are important. All written assignments must be type-written, <u>printed and submitted in class</u> on the due date. Written assignments turned in electronically or after their due date receive a point deduction of 25%. Late assignments must be submitted by the due date for the subsequent writing assignment, or in the case of writing assignment 3, by the last day of class.

• Writing Assignment 1; Discuss Executive Orders.

• Writing Assignment 2; Article review; details provided in class.

• Writing Assignment 3; Discuss *Eminent Domain*, referencing a current example.

#### In-class and homework activities:

In-class and homework activities, worth 15 points each, are assigned throughout the term. <u>These activities are not announced in advance</u>. Examples of activities are quizzes, written responses to news items or end of chapter questions. Missed activities cannot be made up, however only the scores from the five highest activities count toward the maximum 75 points.
