TECHNICAL ASSISTANT ANNOUNCEMENT

The U.S. Civil Service Commission issued the new "Technical Assistant" announcement for positions at the GS-4 level in the Federal service. This announcement will replace the "Engineering Aid and Science Assistant" announcement, and will offer applicants consideration for a wider variety of jobs from a single application.

The new announcement will be used by all agencies to fill technical support positions in the agricultural, biological, and physical sciences; engineering; health sciences; and data processing. Expanded coverage will be to positions such as soil conservation and those in the data processing field.
