Course Description

Introduces college level critical inquiry in academic and professional reading and writing. WR 115 students critically read, summarize, and respond in paragraph format. Students develop expository essay writing skills, review conventions, and use individual and collaborative processes. Note: This course does not satisfy institutional writing requirements for the degree seeking or transfer student.

Course Outcomes

Upon successful completion of this course, students will be able to:

- Write thoughtful, clear, and focused paragraphs and essays for a variety of purposes.
- Illustrate critical reading by clearly summarizing, paraphrasing, and directly quoting.
- Distinguish your ideas from others' ideas in your writing.

- Focus a main point and develop this main point clearly and logically using examples and illustrations in a well- organized essay.
- Revise writing using standard college editing and proofreading conventions (grammar, syntax, spelling, punctuation).

General Class Expectations

Time expectations

A three-credit class like this one demands about three hours for the online equivalent of campus class time. No Show Policy

Students who do not contact me **in the first week** will be dropped from the course. Completing an assignment or posting to a forum will satisfy this.

Incompletes

Only students who have completed **80%** of the course and who are experiencing **unique circumstances** will be considered for an incomplete grade. Any incomplete grade that is granted must be followed up the next term with additional course work.

Participation

Because your active participation is crucial for your learning and assessment, **part of the class grade is based on participation**. If you're struggling to stay engaged, please reach out to me. You can keep your participation score high by engaging in discussions, asking questions, or making an appointment for my office hours.

Deadlines and Late Work

Refer to the schedule for specific weekly and term deadlines. I do not accept late work. Please be proactive, don't procrastinate, and complete your work on time.

Exception: each student may submit **one** assignment after its deadline. Please do not waste this privilege—save it for an actual **emergency**. Notify me on Canvas in the comment box on the assignment submission page. State that you are taking advantage of the "emergency late assignment policy." You may not use the emergency late policy for a draft. The deadline for an emergency submission is 12/2.

Rewrites

You are encouraged to resubmit an assignment if you believe you could do better work. I will consider changing the grade if I believe the rewrite is a *significant improvement*. **Any rewrites must be submitted by 12/2**.

Academic Honesty

You must do your own work. Not citing borrowed ideas (even research) is plagiarism, and can result in a failed grade for an assignment, or even the entire course. Any student who represents someone else's composition as their own will automatically fail the course. Unsanctioned use of generative A.I. qualifies as plagiarism.

Technology

- If at all possible, work from a computer, not a phone or tablet. Working from computer will save you time and frustration when writing and when using Canvas. If you do not have access to a computer, the school can probably help. Contact me about options.
- Please have a contingency plan in case your computer stops working. A smartphone or tablet can be a backup, but isn't ideal.
- **Save your work**. I strongly recommend that you back up your work in more than one place. For example, consider saving to a hard drive and to the internet (Dropbox, Google Drive, etc.).

If you lack access to technology, please email me confidentially. The school might be able to help.

Canvas

We are using Canvas LMS (not Moodle) as the basis for our class.
