DEAN ARCHIBALD CONGRATULATIONS!

Our own Lee Archibald has been elected to the Executive Committee of the Oregon High School-College Relation Council (OHSCRC) and will represent Oregon community Colleges in the executive council meetings. The OHSCRC was established in 1965 to coordinate and establish guidelines for contacts between high schools and colleges in Oregon, and is composed of fifty representatives from Oregon high schools and colleges.

NO CAPS & GOWNS FOR FACULTY

The re-vote was negative - 22 "no" and 11 "yes" - for faculty members to wear caps and gowns at the graduation.

DATE CHANGE! The date of LBCC graduation cerenonies has been changed from Thursday, June 11, to Friday, June 12, to avoid conflicts with evening college classes, according to Dean Archibald. Otherwise, the event will go as planned 8:30 p.m. at the Fellowship Hall of the Methodist Church.

Dr. Earl Klapstein, President of Mt. Hood Community College will be the speaker and approximately 50 students are slated to receive certificates.

Dr. Eldon Schafer, President of Linn-Benton Community College, has announced a special meeting of the LBCC Board of Education at 7:30 a.m. at the Linton House Restaurant, 220 W. Second Avenue in Albany, Wednesday, May 6, 1970.

Dr. Schafer stated the purpose of the meeting as "to consider the amount of the operating budget and set the date for the election in Linn and Benton counties."

The LBCC budget was defeated 'lay 4 by a vote of 6,068, YES, and 6,856, NO.

Dr. Schafer said that the LBCC staff has met to consider possible budget cuts to suggest to the Board of Education, and will ask the Board to consider May 26 as the budget election date along with the State Primary elections. Voters approved on February 25 of this year a 6.1 million dollar bond issue to construct a campus for Linn-Benton Community College, and now we must saek their approval of our operating budget again at the earliest possible date. "LBCC does not have a tax base upon which it can rely for operational funds. It is imperative that to continue the effective operation of the college and hire the personnel necessary to accomodate the increased enrollment and additional vocational training programs, we must be assured of a realistic 1970-71 budget.

"Essentially, we feel that LBCC was organized to provide vocational education for the vast number of students who will benefit in training for the 80% of vocations which do not require a four-year college education."

Schafer pointed to additional occupational programs as a major reason for increases in the 1970 budget, including "the addition of a Dental Assistant program, a two-year Associate Degree (R.N.) Nursing program, a second year of Drafting Technology and Environmental Control Technology."
