


GED GENERAL EDUCATION DEVELOPMENT



What?

It is a series of five multiple choice tests and a writing sample. Successful completion of the tests earns a High School Certificate of Equivalency from the Oregon State Department of Education.

Who?

Adults, 18 years old, who have not graduated from high school may test. 16 and 17 year olds must provide proof they are legally released from compulsory attendance. The release may be obtained from the last school attended. Parent/Guardian's signature of approval is also required.

How?


Come to the main LBCC Campus. Pay the \$30 testing fee in the Business Office (College Center 130). Bring your receipt and identification which shows both your birthdate and photograph to the Student Assessment Center, Takena Hall, second floor.

When?

Testing hours are:
Tuesday and Thursday
9:00 a.m. to noon and 1:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m.

Evening hours are:
Tuesday and Thursday
6:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m.,
except during school vacations and summer term.


Day testing is closed the first week of every term.



Are the Tests Timed?


Yes, time limits are:

1. English, 120 minutes
2. Social Studies, 85 minutes
3. Science, 95 minutes
4. Reading, 65 minutes
5. Mathematics, 90 minutes



How Can I Prepare for a Test?

Preparation classes are available at each of the LBCC centers: Albany, Corvallis, Lebanon, and Sweet Home. Both daytime and evening classes are listed in the LBCC Schedule of Classes. The classes are helpful in your preparation for any or all of the tests.



What Do I Need to Pass?

You need a score of at least 40 on each test, and a final average score of at least 45 when testing is complete. If you need to, you may retest at no additional fee to meet these requirements.
