Course Description

This is a required course for all first year LBCC Welding and Fabrication Technology majors for fall, winter and spring term. Students will learn teamwork skills, principles, and practices applicable to the industrial workplace, including respectful cooperation and communication, being a team player, and working collectively as a group to accomplish a common goal. Recognize the potential benefits of working as a team. Demonstrate the ability to work within a group to accomplish a collective common goal.
