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COURSE DESCRIPTION: A structured, basic level course in drawing designed to:

- 1) Strengthen the perceptual skills necessary to render form and space on a two-dimensional field, and
- 2) To develop a sensitivity to the artist's way of "seeing" as an alternate way to experience the visual world. Assignments will be given and discussed in class via lectures, demonstrations, and group critiques. Students will be exposed to global art traditions as they relate to studio concepts and will spend lab time drawing in order to successfully complete the assigned problems.

COURSE OUTCOMES: As a result of taking this class, students will be able to:

- Demonstrate proficiency in their ability to apply the conventions of drawing that give the illusion of three-dimensional space.
- Be able to demonstrate their ability to use basic black and white drawing materials such as pencils and charcoal on drawing paper.
- Demonstrate how to develop a drawing from initial compositional sketches to a fully developed drawing complete with a minimum of six values.
- Apply line techniques for rendering value and form.
- Design drawings from observation as well as demonstrate a final product from theory using the principles of linear perspective and geometric shapes.
- Demonstrate competence with a basic drawing vocabulary.
- Be exposed to professional presentation practices as determined by individual instructor including portfolio preparation, matting of 2-D artwork and participation in a student exhibition.

COURSE POLICY AND NATURE OF THE CLASS

- 1. Regular attendance and active participation. This includes promptness, working in class, participation in critiques and discussions.
- 2. Behavior that interferes with the orderly functioning of the class, with an individual's pursuit of education, or disrupts the learning environment is prohibited. Please do not bring laptops or any other electronic media to class; turn off cell phones.
- 3. All necessary tools and materials must be brought to each class. See about lockers.
- 4. Turn in completed assignments on time. Sign and date each drawing.
- 5. You must be present at critiques to show your work. Absence will result in a reduced grade for that project.
- 6. Drawing outside of class is required and necessary for success.
- 7. Daily assignments, lectures, and/or demonstrations are given during the first 20-30 minutes of class; you are expected to be on time. Do not leave early unless it has been cleared ahead of time with the instructor for a legitimate reason.
- 8. Wear clothing that is comfortable and that can be soiled with charcoal or pencil smudges, or bring apron.

- 8. The last 10 minutes of class will be devoted to clean-up. This instills sound studio habits as well as preparing for the incoming class with which we share studio space.
- 9. Attendance is critical. After 3 absences, your grade is in jeopardy of dropping a letter grade. More than 5 absences may result in a failing grade. Three tardies results in one absence.
- 10. If you miss a class, be sure to get the notes from a classmate and then see me about examples and demonstrations.

DEADLINES AND GRADING

Critique and drawing assignment deadlines must be met without exception. Failure to meet any deadline will result in a lowered grade for that project or portfolio. Incomplete drawings or portfolios will not be graded. Stay in touch with the instructor by email if you have been absent.
