## Course Description:

Introduces Adobe Photoshop® and Adobe Illustrator® for image manipulation and creation. Students will be introduced to tools used in both applications. Investigate capturing, processing and publishing for different digital image types. Projects will investigate various aspects of shapes, paths, points, fills and gradients. Emphasis will be placed on file management, printing and color management. Student projects, reading and exams will be required to complete the class.

## Course Outcomes:

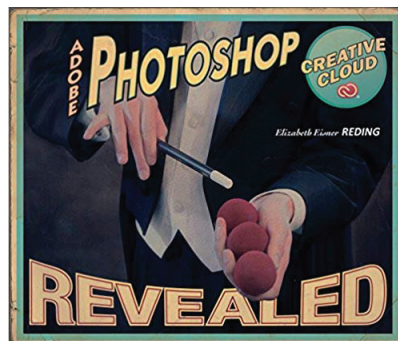
- Create a vector illustration.

- Create and export Photoshop documents.
- Use Photoshop to repair and or modify images.
- Use opacity and blending modes for Online an print documents.

## Canvas:

## Method of Evaluation:
