**COURSE DESCRIPTION:** This class covers the fundamental principles of double-entry accounting, the general journal and general ledger, simple financial statements, the accounting cycle, control of cash, and an introduction to payroll accounting.

HOMEWORK: Exercises and problems at the end of each chapter will be assigned as homework. All homework assignments will be completed via Pearson's MyAccountingLab. The MyAccountingLab website provides students with built in templates, tutorials, opportunities for practice, and assessment via online quizzes. Your homework must be completed before the start of each respective class that it is scheduled to be reviewed in. Late homework will be accepted with reduced credit.

QUIZZES AND EXAMS: There is a required quiz following each chapter's homework review. There will be 4 exams. If you find that you will have to miss an exam, please make arrangements AHEAD OF TIME to make up the exam. If a student misses an exam and has not made prior arrangements to make it up, the exam grade will be reduced 20% (late penalty). Exams must be made up within one week of the test date. After that, the student will forfeit the exam. Exceptions will be made for emergency situations.

## STUDENT-INSTRUCTOR EXPECTATIONS:

Success in this class depends upon both of us. You and I are expected to:

- ATTEND REGULARLY and arrive at class on time.
- Inform each other ahead of time if we know we will be absent.
