

HISTORY OF LBCC AND THE BASEBALL TEAM

The endeavor to establish Linn-Benton Community College began in 1963 through the cooperative efforts of the Linn County Chamber of Commerce and community leaders in Benton County. In 1964, a study prepared by the University of Oregon's Bureau of Educational Reasearch documented the need for a community college in the two-county area.

In 1966, through a local election, the Linn-Benton Community College District was formed. In the fall of 1967, 2,800 students enrolled in the college's first classes, held in rented facilities throughout the district.

Following voter approval of a 6.1 million bond issue in 1970, the college moved from its headquarters at 203 W. First Avenue in Albany to the present college site. Classes were held in trailers and modular buildings during the construction of permanent facilities.

As the campus has grown, so has the student body. Currently, over 27,000 people take one or more classes through LBCC each year, or a full-time equivalent of nearly 5,000 full-time students, making LBCC the fifth largest of Oregon's community colleges.

An important component of the LBCC campus is the athletic program and the quality athletes that it attracts. Included in the athletic program are: the women's basketball, track, and volleyball teams and the men's basketball, track, and baseball teams.

The first LBCC baseball team was initiated by Mr. Dick McClain in 1970. Mr. McClain coached the Roadrunners to the first Oregon Community College Athletic Association Championship. Mr. McClain coached the LBCC baseball team from 1971 through 1976 and led the Roadrunners to OCCAA championships in five out of those six years. Mr. McClain successfully stepped down from coaching duties at LBCC in 1976 with Mr. Dave Dangler taking over the helm in the fall of '76. Dangler led his teams to three league titles, three regional titles and participated in the NJCAA College World Series in three of the six years.

Coach Greg Hawk accepted the teaching and coaching duties at LBCC in 1983. Coach Hawk has led the LBCC Baseball Roadrunner teams to five NWAACC Southern Region League titles in the past seven seasons. He has taken the Linn-Benton baseball teams to the NWAACC playoffs seven times out of his nine year tenure and brought home the NWAACC championship trophy two out of the last five years, both in 1988 and 1991. Over the past 26 years, one thing hasn't changed; LBCC cares about their success, both academically and in the promotion of quality athletic teams. If history repeats itself, LBCC is looking forward to a successful year ahead keeping with the tradition of providing a solid academic base for its athletes as well as the opportunity to continue playing collegiate athletics.

1993 Season Preview

The "Northwest Baseball Tradition" is about to begin at Linn-Benton Community College. After assessing players during fall and winter workouts and putting them up against outside competition like Lower Columbia Community College, Chemeketa, OSU JV's, NW Allstars from Washington state, and Clackamas Community College, Coach Hawk is excited with the players that are donning Linn-Benton uniforms.

After graduating four starters and four of the top five pitching staff, Coach Hawk's team will have a lot of new faces in the lineup. He will be counting on leadership roles from the following sophomores: John Downing, second team All-southern region selection behind the plate; Scott Anderson, first team All-southern region outfielder last season who will be moving to the first base position; Todd Morehead who hit .288 a year ago who will be playing an important role in the outfield this season; and Scott Hardin, second team All-southern region shortstop. Returning pitching staff includes Jeremy Beard, Ben Lofton, Bill Pennick, Brad Livsey, and Phil Lyman who will provide depth and maturity from the mound.

"We will be very tough defensively this year and if we execute


fundamentally, we can close up at the top of our league this Roadrunners offensively. year," Coach Hawk states. Helping to accomplish this feat will be new players on the roster including Darin Piburn from Sprague High School, catcher-designated hitter Ben Graves from Eagle Point, third baseman Kevin Holland of McNary, Doug McCauley out of Crater High School helping out at first base, DH positions, and second baseman Stephen Hagen of South Salem. In addition, Hawk has six Puerto Rican players who learned about Linn-Benton's great baseball tradition through Coach Terrell Ayo, who coaches at Crescent Valley. These players include drafted freshman Carlos Williams, centerfield; Joel Kercado, third base; Jose' Cepeda, second base; Javier Hernandez, short-

stop; Willie Resto, pitcher; and Carmelo Carrasquillo, outfield. Offensively, the Roadrunners top pitching should come from a pair of freshmen and a well-traveled


sophomore. Jeff Tuck, a 6-foot-1, 175 pounder from Glencoe, earned most valuable player honors at last spring's State-Metro prep all-star series in The Dalles. The other freshman is 6-4, 190-pound Eric Schaffner, a McNary alum whom Hawk says is "just really solid." Rounding out the trio is Mark Andersen. The 6-2, 203-pound Andersen went to high school at Churchill and came to LB after stops at Lane and San Luis Obispo's Cuesta College.

"We have the pitchers to be successful," Hawk states. "Offensively and defensively we're very solid. We're looking for great things to happen this year and I feel that we will give the other teams we play a run for their money."


Coach Hawk understands the value of fine baseball traditions and believes that this season will be one of those seasons where it could fall right into place. "We have sophomore leaders, strong pitching capabilities, tough fundamental defensive, and the right kind of chemistry to make it work. We've been to the top, and we know what it's about," Hawk states. "I think we have a team that can get the job done."

Coach Hawk is presently in his tenth season at Linn-Benton Community College and is preparing his Roadrunners for another run at the Northwest Athletic Association of Community Colleges Southern Region title and a return trip to the NWAACC league tournament. Hawk accepted the Roadrunner job in 1983 after earning his Masters of Science in Athletic Administration at Eastern Washington University. He has compiled a 142-77 (.648) league record and an overall record of 213-138 (.606) in the past eight seasons at LBCC. Winning is a tradition at Linn-Benton from the past to the present. "When I came to LB, I knew there would be great expectations of me due to the rich baseball tradition of the past" said Hawk. "I like that type of pressure, to excel, it drives you to be more competitive than your opponents."

Hawk understands competition and excellence. He was the first player from Centerville High School (Iowa) to be selected to the All-State team (1st team) as a catcher. Hawk played his college baseball at Northwest Missouri State University in Maryville, Missouri. Upon graduation from college in 1980, Hawk accepted a teaching/coaching position at Sweet Springs, Missouri. Hawk led the Sweet Springs baseball teams for

two years achieving a 28-4 record and reaching the regional finals his second year.

Along with coaching and teaching duties, Coach Hawk leads a busy family life. His wife, Beth, and two daughters, April Renee and Whitney continue to enjoy leading the life of a sports oriented family. You will see them in the cheering section at a majority of the LBCC games, especially at tournament time.

"Education is the key to upward mobility. You get out of school what you put into it," says Hawk. "I have great expectations of my athletes in the classroom as well as on the ball field. A small percentage of college athletes actually get a chance to play professional baseball, therefore, I believe it is very important to have an education to utilize later in life."

Hawk has some basic philosophies about baseball and instills them into each club he coaches. "I want my players to work hard and to be competitive," said Hawk. "I want them to want to achieve their goals and to have high expectations of themselves. Work ethics should carry through from practice to the games."

Hawk designs teams according to his baseball philosophy and to the character of each team. Every year brings a different chemistry of players with the coaching staff molding and shaping each team to be highly competitive.

With outstanding defense and solid pitching, LB clubs have kept up with the tradition of fine baseball. LBCC ballclubs feel the pressures from their opponents each year. All players, whether they are pitching, playing outfield, or at an infield position have to be ready both mentally and physically every time they go out on the ball field," Hawk stated.

Hawk looks at his 1993 team as one that could be strong contenders for the Southern Division league title as well as achieve a berth to the NWAACC tournament. "The 1993 team will be young due to the loss of veteran pitching and several second year players. The ball players we have this year have determination, team camaraderie and heart. I believe they will grow and mature in their playing abilities as the season progresses. The league is going to be a tough one again this year and the opponents will be out to beat the team with the tradition.
