Some courses are offered at more than one center. Check your center class schedule for individual course listings.

Agriculture

Beekeeping - The successful management of honeybees, including hive construction, protective clothing, pollination, storing through hibernation, marketing honey.

Hoof Care - The trimming, and care of hooves, their anatomical structure, nailing on shoes in emergencies, with labe practice.

Home Gardening & Landscaping - The unifying and elements of residential landscape design. Both natural and man-made elements studied. Gardening and maintenance tips.

Horse Problems - Help in handling problems of broodstock, training, judging, marketing, business management. Also use and conformation of the horse.

Livestock Care - General practices related to feeding, care, selection, and management of livestock.

Business

Switchboard-Reception Techniques - Operation and function of switchboards. (770 Electronic, Call Director, multiple line hand sets). For employees of offices with switchboards, direction in using the telephone budget to the fullest.

Operating Small Calculators - Using the electronic calculator for various computational problems. Included will be the four basic functions (addition, subtraction, multiplication, division) as well as combined operations, reciprocals, square roots, exponentials manipulations, memory units, log and trip function.

Citizens and City Hall - Using your rights effectively during traffic arrest, untangling the web of government, influencing land use, understanding funding, lobbying and campaigning. Instructor is a former District Attorney.

Home & Family Living

Creative Weaving [Off-Loom] - Build your own hand loom and produce artistic hangings and accessories using natural fibers and materials. Design ideas, demonstrations.

Drop-Spindle Spinning - The ancient and effective simple method of spinning fleece and natural fibers with an inexpensive drop spindle (about \$3).

Macrame - Step by step foundation of macrame knots, producing many attractive articles, including plant hangings, owls, wall hangings, and different unusual cords.

Machine Embroidery - Basics of machine embroidery, stitches and how to use them, appliques, monograms, edge finishes, and yarn stitchery.

Make Your Own Patterns - 10 week course covers basic techniques in fitting and making individualized patterns. Students can design and construct garments, adapt commercial patterns, and achieve better fit.

Cake Decorating - Decorating cakes for all occasions and seasons. Learn to use professional equipment, work with different icings, and make icing decorations.

Entertain With a Flair - Using Small Equipment - Cooking with style and flair for family entertaining using a combination of conventional range, microwave oven and small appliances such as blender, electric pot, etc. Demonstration and tasting of complete meal each session.

Patchwork Quilting - Piecing, construction and quilting to the finished product, emphasizing new ideas and time-saving techniques.

Medicinal Herbs and Culinary Spices - Recognition and preparation of the local culinary and medicinal herbs and spices. Nutritive values of herbs where they are known, and a basic knowledge of some of the pharmacological properties.

Microwave Cookery - Techniques and procedures in the use of microwave ovens and background in the mechanics. Includes timing and preparing meals with recipes suited to microwave ovens.

Sourdough Bread Baking - How to make good white and whole grain bread, rolls, and sweet dough, including an examination of the nutritional value of bread.

Buying a House - For those considering buying an existing house. Includes learning to examine the house for family needs, and financial investment. Locating potential expensive problems and needed repairs, financing the home.

Upholstery - Basic principles and techniques of upholstery, including rewebbing, spring tying, padding, and final covering through demonstration and individual student projects.

Color Coordination and Decorating for the Home - Study of the use of color and line as they pertain to interior design; treatment of windows, walls, and floors; selection and arrangement of furnishings.

Cabinet Making - Fundamentals and procedures for cabinet construction, operating the power equipment safely.

Basic Tax Preparation - Personal and small business income taxation. To inform the student of his obligations and rights under current income tax laws.

Investment and Insurance - Basic principles of financial management. Building your financial goals. Study of compounding profits, life insurance, investments-including stocks, bonds, and real estate-income tax and estate planning.

Planning Ahead for Retirement - Economics, housing, legal concerns, recreation, health and aging, human relations, transportations, mental attitudes and other topics of retirement planning. Ideal for couples.

Managing Life Vs. Life Managing You - Add organization to the problem solving process called life. Emphasis on: you in charge, creative goal setting, communications as a tool, making choices, planning and integrating life action.

Getting Your Money's Worth - Evaluate and plan to successfully manage money. Explore personal attitudes toward money, evaluate personal spending plans, the role of insurance, the credit game, and consumer laws and rights.

Managing Life Vs. Life Managing You - Add organization to the problem solving process called life. Emphasis on: you in charge, creative goal setting, communications as a tool, making choices, planning and integrating life action.

Pruning and Grafting - Learn to improve plant growth for beauty or profit through the skills of pruning and grafting. Lecture, demonstration lab, and field trips.

Greenhouse Care & Management - A practical course in the construction of small greenhouses, equipment, management, propagating and growing.

Care of Houseplants - Plant environment, such as exposure to light, moisture, temperature, fertilizing, disease and insects.

Poisonous Plants - Toxic plants common to the Northwest, including various household and garden plants. Plants known to be toxic to both livestock and man will be included. The signs and symptoms of ingestion and the emergency treatment will be presented.

Human Relations

Single Again - Bringing together single people and leaders of various community resources for the purpose of developing a stable, full and enriching life as a single in the community.

Old Testament Survey - An historical survey of the Old Testament through maps, charts, films and slides. Development of the Hebrew nation to Christ's time. The dating, authors, and content of the books.

Language Arts

Languages - Beginning study in conversational German, Spanish, and French are offered, in addition to conversational German II.

Math Science

Thinking Metrically - A basic course dealing with the utilization of the Metric system as a form of measurement. Emphasis on actual measurement of length, mass, area, volume, and temperature in accordance with the International System of Measurement Units. (Metric System)

Parent/Child Education

You and Your Teen - A look at effective parenthood for the teen years stressing communication skills. Participants will practice dealing with common problems and learn to understand the adolescent development process.

Matching Tests to Activities for Preschoolers - Tests and subtests appropriate to the performance of pre-school, kindergarten and 1st grade children. Distinguishing between test objectives to meet the needs of individuals or groups.

Creative Arts for Adults Who Work With Children - A series of workshops, focusing on one or two types of creative activities for children 5-12. The activities presented will be for use in home, school, camp, Girl/Boy Scout troops, etc. and will go beyond the usual arts and crafts.

PE & Health

Women's Health Tools - Course offers an integration of health tools including diet related exercise, anatomy, swedish massage, health awareness.

Art

Photography - Historical insight, camera operation, accessory equipment, introduction to black and white lab techniques, camera techniques, composition, line, form.

Art Metal Tooling - A project oriented course in tooling, embossing, antiquing and designing with various foils. Develop metal foils into pictures and decorative and functional art objects.

Tole Painting - Fundamentals of tole or decorative painting, preparing boards or metal items for painting, transferring designs, painting designs, antiquing and finishing.

Calligraphy - Calligraphy and lettering systems, skill and discretion in applying lettering. Instruction in a basic lettering system, supplementary forms of lettering, pens, inks, and papers.

Leathercraft - Aimed at the beginning leather craftsman, it will involve basic techniques and the finer aspects of work that would be considered quality.

Beginning Crafts for the Handicapped - Basketry, pottery, macrame and candlemaking.

Crafts for the Blind - Working with leather, clay, wood, weaving, rug making, stuffed animals, tools, and pillows. Other possibilities will be considered as suggestions are made.

Music

Music - Folk guitar, beginning and intermediate, also piano theory.

Recreation

Modern Dance - An introduction to the modern dance idiom. History and personalities, basic technology. Introduces use of principles of composition in combination with elements of dance in developing a dance. Short, creative studies and understanding how to critique.

Oriental Dance - Teaches the techniques and free movements of belly dancing, as well as the physical and relaxation part of the dance.

Social Science

Creative Writing - Survey and exploration of forms of creative writing, including prose and poetry, taught in workshop situation.

Special Interest

Basic Seamanship - Instruction in the basics of boating, stressing safety. Topics are aids to navigation, radio telephone, weather, marine engines, and regulations.

Trade & Industrial

Land Surveyor's Review - A review of materials covered on the Oregon State Board of Engineering Examiners Professional Land Surveyors Exam. Topics include: Basic Math, errors in surveying, traverse and level computations, curve and earthwork, topographic mapping and coordinate systems, Oregon land survey law, photogrammetry, field astronomy, US Public Land Survey, introduction to Geodesy, and principles of the profession.

Welding I and II - I-Use of stick welder and oxyacetylene cutting and welding processes. II-Requirements of selected industrial welding processes, occupational hazards and safe working conditions will be stressed thoroughly.

Waiter/Waitress Training - Focus on locating problem areas and compiling some recommendations to alleviate these situations. Attitudes, appearance and ability.

Auto Tune-Up - Basic automobile engine tune-up and small motor tune-up. Includes preventive maintenance.

Bicycle Maintenance - Overhauls, adjustments, lubrication, and preventive maintenance for all levels of experience.

Basic Power Woodworking - Use of basic woodworking machinery, special applications, design, material selection, finishing.

Motorcycle Repair & Tune-Up - To instruct students as to proper up-keep and maintenance of all types of motorcycles.

Self Improvement

ABE - Free classes for those 16 and older who have not finished grade or high school. Reading, English, and math courses.

GED - Free classes for those people 16 and older not currently enrolled in a high school who want to prepare for high school equivalency tests. English, Math, Reading, Literature, Natural Science, and Social Science courses are offered.

Registration Information for Students Taking 8 or More Credit Hours

Steps to be taken before you stand in line to register:

- Admission** - Students planning to enroll for 8 or more credit hours: File an Application for Admission; file transcripts from previous schools attended; make arrangements to take the Comparative Guidance and Placement Test (CGP)
- Advising** - New students enrolling for 8 or more credit hours will receive advising help during the advising/registration period planned for new students. New students who have completed the admissions process will be assigned a date for advising by the Admissions Office. Continuing students may plan their own programs and register without staff approval. If assistance is necessary, contact a faculty advisor or the Guidance Center.
- Program Approval** - All NEW students must secure counselor approval (CC-110) of their program.
- Graduation Requirements** - Students expecting to receive an Associate Degree or departmental certificate from LBCC must apply for graduation in the Admissions and Career Information Center one term prior to graduation.
- Registration** - Pick up a long-form registration packet in the registration area. Check for posted lists of filled, cancelled, added, or changed classes. fully complete each form in ballpoint pen. Make sure all copies are legible.

All continuing students in the following special programs will be required to register prior to the last day of the preceding term to assure their place in the program. Space remaining in the program after the last day of the term will be opened to new students.

6. **Tuition and Fees** - Full tuition payment is usually necessary at the time of registration. Insurance premiums should also be paid if insurance is desired.

Students sponsored by a special program or attending under a grant or scholarship must pick up an authorization at the Financial Aids Office BEFORE REGISTERING.

The Deferred Payment Plan may be used by full-time students (12 or more credit hours). One third of the tuition is paid at the time of registration and the balance by the end of the fifth week of class. Application for this plan must be made at the Financial Aids Office (CC-107) BEFORE REGISTERING, and a Deferred Payment Agreement must be presented at the time of registration.

7. **Veteran's benefits and special programs** - Students receiving benefits (GI Bill, Veteran's Vocational Rehabilitation, Veteran's Dependent, or Social Security) have the responsibility of starting the necessary paper work each term in order to receive these benefits. Complete the form in the registration packet and carefully follow the printed instructions. Contact the Veteran's Clerk in the Veteran's Office (CC-121) if you have questions.

Registration Information for Students Taking 7 or Less Credit Hours

Register during the pre-registration period or during the first three weeks of classes.

Enrolling in day classes the second week requires the instructor's written permission.

Enrolling the third week in any class requires the instructor's written permission and a \$1.00 late fee.

Steps to be taken before you stand in line to register:

- Admission** - There are no admission requirements for students taking 7 or fewer credit hours.
- Program approval** - Counselor approval is not required. However, counselors are available to assist students if desired.
- Registration** - Pick up a short-form registration packet in the registration area. Check for posted lists of filled, cancelled, added, or changed classes. fully complete each form in ballpoint pen. Make sure all copies are legible.
- Tuition and Fees** - Full tuition must be paid at the time of registration.
- Veteran's benefits and special programs** - Students receiving benefits (GI Bill, Veteran's Vocational Rehabilitation, Veteran's Dependent, or Social Security) have the responsibility of starting necessary paper work each term in order to receive these benefits. Complete the form in the registration packet and carefully follow the printed instructions. Contact the Veteran's Clerk in the Veteran's Office CC-121 if you have any questions.

Guidance & Counseling

The following students are required to have counselor approval of their programs:

- New students who are registering for 8 or more credit hours.
- Students being sponsored by a special program, such as DVR, etc.
- Students on probation or in danger of failure.
- Students changing their majors.

In addition, any student who wishes counseling assistance in planning his program is encouraged to contact a faculty advisor or the Guidance Center for an appointment.

Pass Grading

Certain courses listed in the schedule have an "OPT" designation in the PNP column. Each student in that class has the option of taking the course for the usual A, B, C, D, or F grade or taking it on a pass/no pass basis. On these courses only, the student may request a P/NP Option Form from the instructor any time during the quarter up to the last day of regular classes. Once the P/NP has been elected, the student may not change back to regular grading without the permission of the instructor. If uncertain about requesting the P/NP, the student should wait until the last day to make a decision.

Courses listed in the schedule with "PNP" in that column are those where only pass or no pass grades are issued.

The maximum of "P" credits allowed toward an LBCC degree will be 16 hours, not including those with mandatory pass (P) grading. Students should consult with a counselor before deciding to choose the pass (P) grade. It is not advisable for a student to choose the "P" grade in a course that is considered a major course in his field of study. Students planning to transfer to a four-year institution should check that institution's requirements regarding the "P."

Adding Classes

To add a class, an add slip must be presented at the Registration Office and any additional tuition paid. Students taking 8 or more credit hours may add classes through the first week on a space-available basis. Students carrying a total of 7 or less credit hours may add classes during the first two weeks on a space-available basis. However, adding classes during the second week requires written permission of the instructor. There is no add fee for the first change of schedule involving one or more added classes. The charge for each additional change is \$2.

Dropping Classes

To officially drop a class requires presentation of a drop slip at the Registrar's Office. Students who withdraw without giving written notice to the Registration Office will forfeit all claims to refund of tuition and will remain responsible for their grade in the class. Students who withdraw from all their classes must also complete a "Total Drop Form" at the Registrar's Office.

Non-Attendance

Students who are unable to attend a class regularly may jeopardize their enrollment in that class. If you must miss a class, you should contact the instructor immediately. During the term the College is making adjustments in the class registrations, and other students are waiting to enroll.

Insurance

Hospitalization and accident insurance is available to all students at the time of registration. Brochures giving details of this coverage are available in the Registration Office. Premium must be paid at the time of registration or prior to the fourth week of the term.

Golden Age Club

Senior citizens (65 years and older) may wish to acquire an LBCC Golden Age Card. The bearer of the card is granted tuition and fee waivers to most college classes on a space available basis, and all college activities. The cards are available in the Community Education Office.

Refunds

To receive a refund, students must submit a drop slip to the Registration Office within the first five weeks of the term. Refunds will be mailed after the second week of classes.

The amount of refund:

Official withdrawal by a student carrying 8 or more credits = full refund less \$15

Official withdrawal by a student carrying 7 or less credits = full refund less \$5

Official withdrawal by a student paying \$8.75 or enrolled in Community Education non-credit classes = full refund less \$2.50

Reduction of credit load = difference in tuition amounts (to the minimum charge)

Classes cancelled by the college = full refund or re-enrollment in another class providing student notifies Registration Office.

Records Information

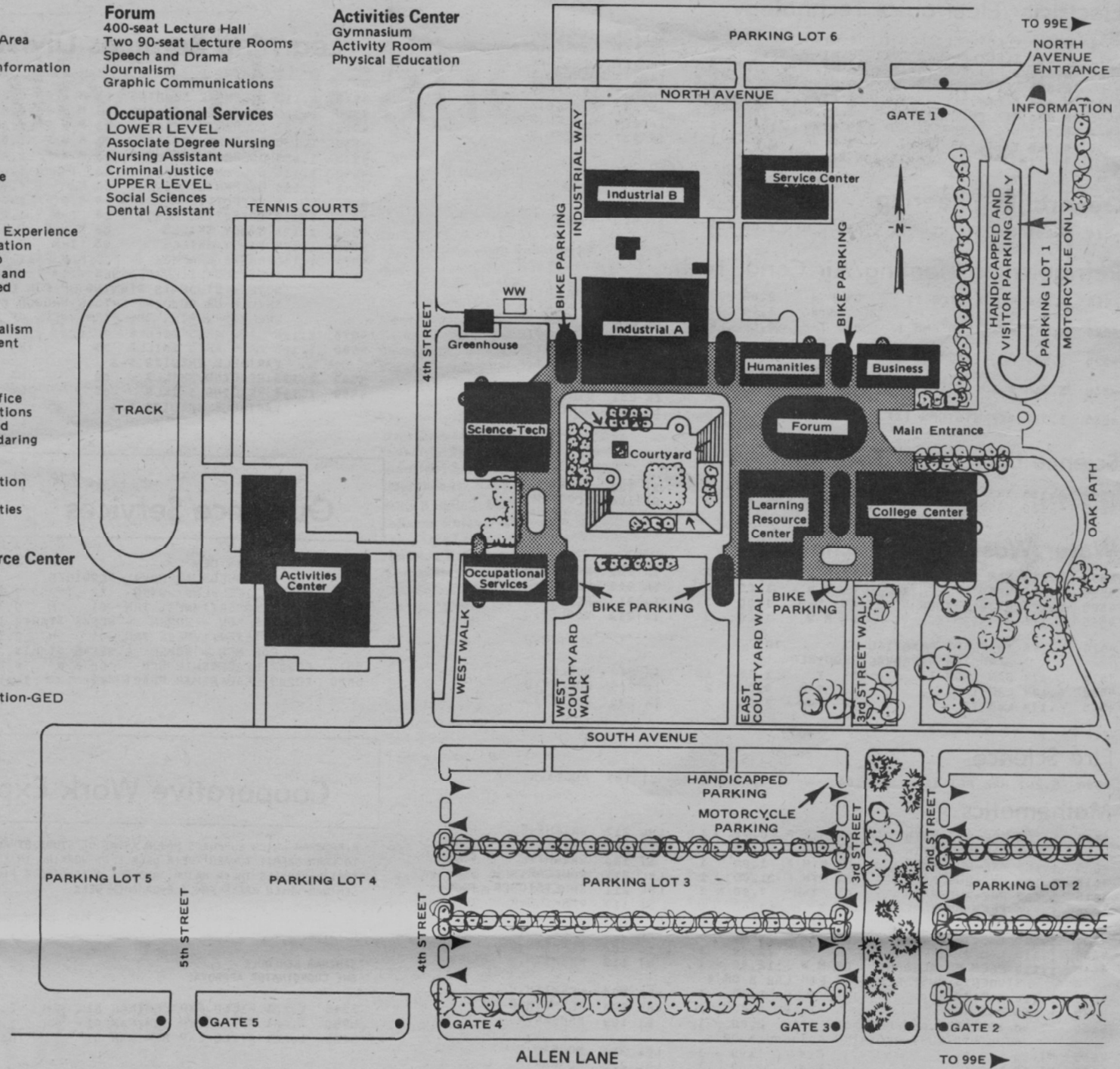
