Course Description:

This is a two part capstone course. The first part will feature review of Oregon statutory law and Oregon Administrative Rules as they relate to law enforcement and corrections professionals; examination of the Oregon Physical Agility Test (ORPAT); background investigations; OSHA and general workplace safety; dealing with the public and legal liability of law enforcement and corrections professionals. The second part of this course is designed to assess and improve writing skills and to provide instruction on writing professional police reports, memoranda, and documents used in the courtroom.

Course Prerequisites:

- Student must be in their second academic year, at LBCC.
- Student must have already successfully completed WR121-English Composition prior to enrolling in this course.

Requirements:

- <u>Mid-Term Examination-(25% of grade):</u>
 - The test can be a combination of multiple choice, matching, true/false, and/or essay questions. In addition, this test and the final may cover commonly misspelled words used in law enforcement.
- <u>Note Taking and Report Writing-(25% of grade):</u>

Students use a police style notebook to take notes for class assignments. The quality and content of the notes are critical. In addition, students will handwrite reports as assigned by the instructor. The reports must be legible, as well as grammatically correct.

• Final Examination-(25% of grade):

The test can be a combination of multiple choice, matching, true/false, and/or essay questions. In addition, this test and the mid-term exam may cover commonly misspelled words used in law enforcement.

• <u>Class Attendance, Quizzes, Other Assigned Work and Participation-(25% of Grade):</u>

Students will read assigned articles, review laws and regulations that are provided. They will participate in a group setting to network with other students and provide feedback to other students.

Withdrawal Policy:

Official withdrawal from the class is required by the registrar, or you will receive a grade of "F" for failure or "Y" for no basis for grade. Failure and No Basis for Grade will impact your financial aid eligibility. Non-attendance does not constitute withdrawal. For additional withdrawal information, see the registrar's office or refer to the schedule of classes.

Grades:

Grades will be a determined on a percentage basis from the results on the listed requirements; percentages are as follows: "A"=90-100% "B"=80-89% "C"=70-79% "D"=60-69% "F"=Below 59%
