REQUIRED MATERIAL

COURSE DESCRIPTION: Designed to reinforce and supplement payroll skills in both manual formats and computerized formats. Prerequisite: BA 111 Practical Accounting I or BA 211 Principles of Accounting: Financial

In this course, the student will:

- Compute the income tax withholding from employee wages.
- Calculate employee's withholding for IRS Form W-4.
- Determine employer's quarterly estimated payments.
- Describe how the Federal Insurance Contributions Act (FICA) is applied by employers.
- Describe the federal deposit system and how the Electronic Federal Tax Payment System is used by employers.
- Describe the difference between employees and independent contractors.
